th the delightful chaos of the wedding safely behind, honeymoon time is the cherry atop the newlywed sundae, and the ideal fresh beginning for your married days together.



When it's time to venture out, romantic evenings mean lingering over special meals in luxurious venues. There are eight restaurants, and while regional Mexican fare plays a starring role, there's an emphasis on international cuisine that takes full advantage of the bounty of local produce, proteins and dairy the Yucatán is known for.

A couples' favorite is Piaf, with its French flair, contemporary light touch and elegant Parisian-style ambience. The restaurant pays homage to legendary French chanteuse Edith Piaf with dramatic crystal-lined curtains, retro chandeliers and red-and-black-accented décor. Start your meal with crispy oysters with mayonnaise foam or a foie gras terrine served with apple purée, gingerbread ice cream and toasted brioche. Chef Mario Soto's touch includes specially crafted dishes for two like the roasted rock Cornish hen, stuffed with barley and veal and served with roasted vegetables and sherry sauce.

Global tastes are on tap every evening at Grand Velas. Frida, a contemporary Mexican kitchen, honors the extensive repertoire of regional cuisine and beyond. Chaka presents an international take on grilled meats, seafood and pasta. Standout Cocina De Autor takes diners on a creative gastronomic journey with eight to 10 small dishes and delivers a sensory tour of one of Mexico's most acclaimed kitchens.

For a nightcap, venture to the Sky Bar, a rooftop lounge with an ocean view and an ideal place to toast new beginnings. W

HONEYMOON HOT SPOTS

Here are three additional easy-to-reach honeymoon destinations from the Queen City.

Savannah, Ga. - Honeymooners will find this Georgia peach an easy four-hour drive from Charlotte, with plenty of charm alongside contemporary offerings. Couples making the Hotel Bardo Savannah their luxe home away from home are rewarded with blocks of walkable Historic District treats like neighboring Forsyth Park, the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist (often referred to as the "Sistine Chapel of the South"), Girl Scouts founder Juliette Gordon Low's birthplace, and Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil's fabled Bonaventure Cemetery. Acclaimed Lowcountry dining venues like Husk Savannah and The Grey are worth the splurge.

Longboat Key, Fla. - After a two-hour flight to Sarasota/Bradenton from Charlotte, Longboat Key is less than a 30-minute drive but a world away from the buzz of the wedding day. Here, the **Zota Beach Resort** is the perfect sunny honeymoon escape. Perched along the powdery sands of Longboat Key, there's a laidback island ambience and easy access to the Bradenton area's museums, arts, shopping and outdoor adventures. Honeymooners are spoiled with private beach access, a poolside bar and waterfront Florida-Caribbean fusion dining.

Finger Lakes, Sodus, N.Y. - Newlyweds looking to get away from it all will love Maxam Hotels' Finger Lakes Treehouse just outside of Rochester, N.Y., and a two-hour nonstop flight from Charlotte. Adventure, nature and relaxation await couples in an A-Frame treehouse. Luxury amenities include traditional Swedish spa experiences like a cedar-planked sauna and bubbling hot tubs.
